





Hello PCUMC Family,

In the Gospels, Jesus turns to his disciples and asks a question that still requires our attention today:

“But who do you say that I am?” (Matthew 16:15)

It's not a question about having the right words, but about the shape of our lives. Who Jesus is to us shows up in how we live, how we love, what we resist, and what we're willing to risk.

Today is Dietrich Bonhoeffer's birthday. He is one of my heroes in the faith - we even named our son, Dietrich Asher, after him.

Bonhoeffer was born on February 4, 1906. He was a pastor and theologian who refused to separate faith from faithfulness in the real world. He wrote words that continue to challenge the Church today. Here are a few famous quotes:

“When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die.”

“Christianity without discipleship is always Christianity without Christ.”

“Jesus Christ calls us to a costly grace, which involves daily dying to self and living for others.”

“Silence in the face of evil is itself evil. Not to speak is to speak. Not to act is to act.”

“The church is the church only when it exists for others.”

“We must accept the risk of loving, the risk of faithfulness, the risk of being obedient to God in a world of injustice.”

Bonhoeffer's life and writings, his imprisonment, and eventual execution for resisting Hitler and the Nazi regime, remind us that answering Jesus' question is never abstract. It is lived out: often quietly, sometimes courageously, always imperfectly.

May we listen again for Jesus' question to us this week - and have the grace to answer it not only with our words, but with our lives.




New Series begins on February 15
