One of my heroes in the faith, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, reminds us that Christmas is not about God coming to take us away from our suffering, but about God coming into it with us. Christmas tells the story of God arriving as a poor and vulnerable child, born into a world shaped by political oppression, danger, and fear. Bonhoeffer famously wrote, "Only a suffering God can help." In other words, God helps the world not by avoiding pain and hardships, but by sharing it. Christmas is the moment God begins to suffer with the world.

So, the comfort of Christmas is that we are not alone in our struggles, our grief, or our pain. God is with us - present, compassionate, and near. As we move through this week leading up to Christmas, may we hold space for both joy and sorrow, and may we continue to be signs of God's ever-present love for one another and for the world.


Children's Church (Sunday School)
